## Fall 2010 Campout @ Stephen F. Austin State Park

Pack 957 will be holding the annual Fall Camping weekend as follows:

**DATES:** Friday, November 5, 2010, Den camping

Saturday, November 6, 2010, Cub events starting at **1:15 pm**

Sunday, November 7, 2010, Ending at 10:00 am

**LOCATION:** Stephen F. Austin State Park, San Felipe TX 77473-0125

Directions: From Houston, travel west on Interstate 10 to FM 1458 (just before Sealy). Turn right (north) on FM 1458 and then left on Park Road 38.

- Be sure to leave additional time for check-in at the park. There can be a long line, so try to arrive early on Friday or arrive 30-60 minutes before your activity time on Saturday.
- A program of activities is attached. Dens will camp together at assigned campsites (to be assigned on Friday, **check-in with Camp leaders**, expected to be near campsite 40)
- Dens will stay together for camp chores and activities. Each parent is required to accompany his or her son on the campout.
- Saturday Campfire: A highlight of the weekend. Bobcat Ceremony will take place then. Dens are encouraged to do a skit or song (See Kevin Klein to sign up.)
- Suggested items: see page with den rotations page 3. NOTE: *Even if you are not camping, you will need chairs, flashlights and insect repellent.*
- Everyone needs to have water bottle for Saturday afternoon.
- Meals: Saturday dinner is a pack dinner and is catered, Hinze's Barbeque. You are on your own for other meals.
- Activity highlights: For Cubs (Tiger, Wolf, Bears), Saturday afternoon (beginning at 1:30 PM) will be a fun-filled pack time. They will get to learn about astronomy, wildlife tracks, go on a hike, do some carving, do scout skills (including getting the opportunity to raise and lower flags) and launch rockets. See rotation for complete schedule.
- The Pack campout is one of the highlights of the year's activities. It permits the Cub Scouts to enjoy a scouting experience. Each Den or group will be responsible for participating in assigned activities. Parents and Dens will be working to make the activities fun and challenging.
- Stephen F. Austin State Park has an interpretive trail that starts at the HQ. Print out the online trail map and go exploring
